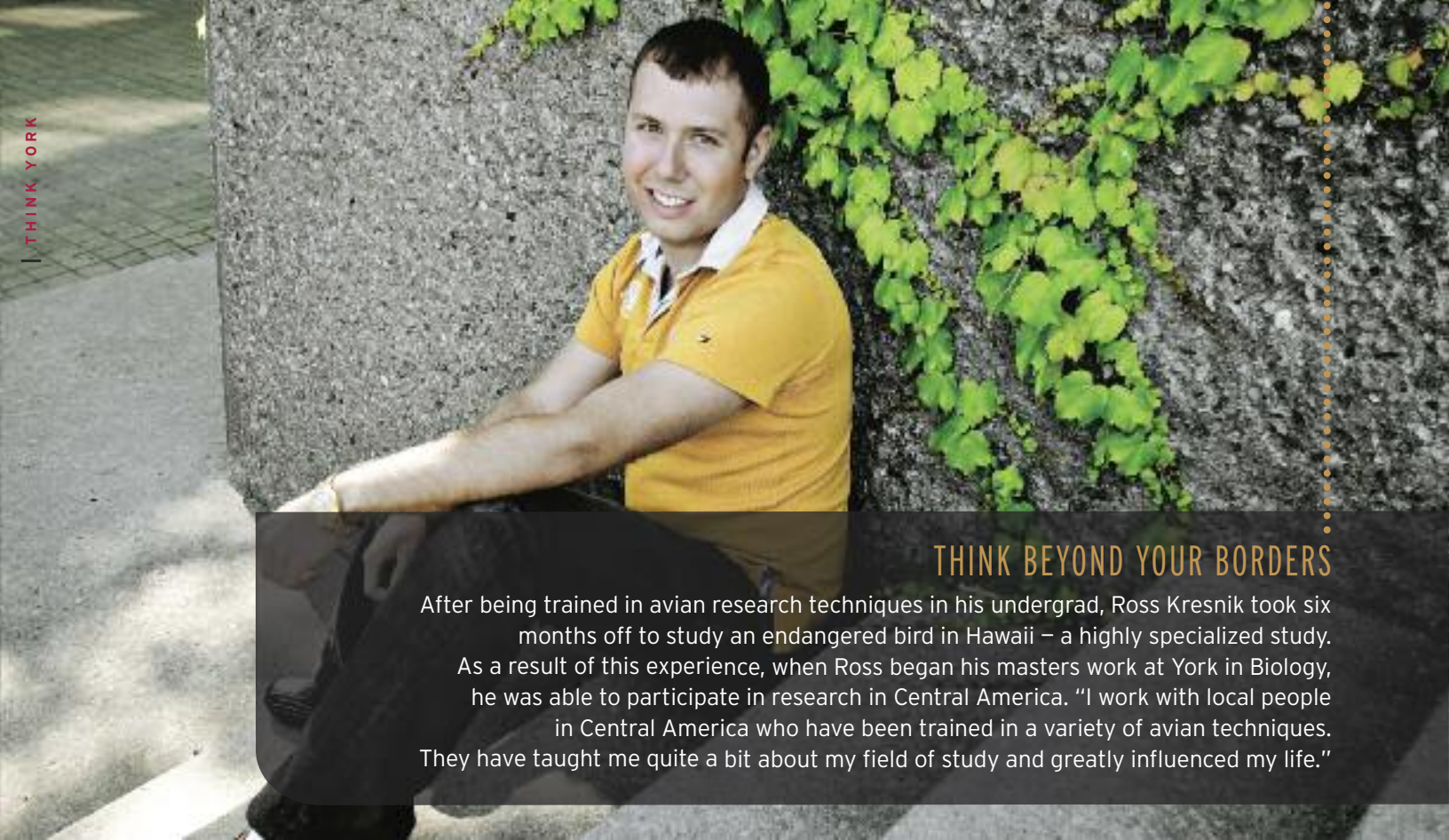

York's 28 research centres and institutes provide unique opportunities for students to participate in leading-edge research, much of which straddles interdisciplinary boundaries. York's internationally renowned Centre for Vision Research houses more than 35 labs including the Human Computer Interaction Lab and the Wilkinson & Wilson lab. Enhance your graduate studies and opportunities for collaboration with the resources available at York's Research Centres, the Archives of Ontario (located on the Keele Campus), and through the important Canadian culture and literature materials housed in the Clara Thomas Archives & Special Collections. Perform and create in our Fine Arts state-of-the-art teaching, exhibition and performance facilities. You can also take advantage of the Geographic Information Systems Research Laboratory, the Earth Observations Laboratories or the Gordon G. Shepherd Atmospheric Research Facility.

YOUR RESEARCH CAN CHANGE OUR WORLD

The Knowledge Mobilization Unit at York, through ResearchImpact, matches researchers with community organizations. York is one of six founding universities of ResearchImpact, Canada's first institutional strategy designed to connect university researchers with community and government organizations to support the use of research in decision-making about social programming, public policy, and professional practice.



THINK BEYOND YOUR BORDERS

After being trained in avian research techniques in his undergrad, Ross Kresnik took six months off to study an endangered bird in Hawaii – a highly specialized study. As a result of this experience, when Ross began his masters work at York in Biology, he was able to participate in research in Central America. “I work with local people in Central America who have been trained in a variety of avian techniques. They have taught me quite a bit about my field of study and greatly influenced my life.”

GO GLOBAL. CHOOSE YORK FOR A WHOLE NEW OUTLOOK ON THE WORLD.

York is a leader in Canada in international research collaborations and opportunities for graduate students to increase their global knowledge and skills. Here's a few examples:

- The Centre for Refugee Studies is concerned with the displacement of populations across borders and its research has an impact on policy development.
- York's Tubman Institute promotes greater understanding of the history of slavery and its legacy and strives to resolve current social injustices.
- At the Las Nubes rainforest in Costa Rica, York faculty, students and international partners conduct valuable research aimed at protecting the biodiversity of the rainforest and aiding the sustainable development of local communities.
- Glendon is home to Canada's first bilingual graduate School of Public & International Affairs. The flagship component of the School, our Master's program offers a uniquely bilingual education that will prepare students for leadership roles in public life.

York is committed to an international campus and experience for our students. Here's what you can expect:

- Last year, 13 master's students from York's Faculty of Environmental Studies travelled to Berlin and Leipzig to participate in a graduate urban planning course, co-taught by a team of York University faculty members.
- Colin McGuire and Chad Walasek are the 2011 recipients of the YCAR Language Award. McGuire, a doctoral candidate in music, will advance his abilities in Cantonese during a year in Hong Kong as an exchange student. Walasek, a master's student in dance at York, will use the award funding to build on his Urdu language skills in a fall 2011 course in India.
- Last year, York International offered PhD students a fully funded course in Denmark to learn about leadership, collaboration and intellectual property rights.
- Sara L. Jackson is the 2011 recipient of the Albert C.W. Chan Foundation Fellowship. She began her PhD at York in geography in 2009. Last summer, she was a language fellow at the American Center for Mongolian Studies in Ulaanbaatar.

COMPETITIVE FUNDING TO SUPPORT YOUR STUDIES

At York University, we value the contribution of our master's and doctoral students. We also know that academic achievement doesn't just happen. It takes hard work, perseverance and support.



York offers competitive funding to excellent full-time students accepted into our graduate programs. Sources for this funding include teaching assistantships, research assistantships, graduate assistantships, and York Graduate Scholarships for our top-ranked students. We also encourage and support students in their applications for prestigious external provincial and national awards. Our students have been awarded, among other notable scholarships, 10 Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarships in the past two years, each worth \$50,000 and renewable for up to three years. Together with additional York funding, external scholarships allow students the time to focus on their research, make progress in their program of study, and are a measure of academic excellence.

York's awards for graduate students

York offers a range of awards for incoming and continuing students, including:

- Elia Scholars Program is York University's most prestigious graduate award for incoming domestic or international doctoral students.
- Graduate Fellowships for Academic Distinction (GFAD) are scholarships awarded to incoming doctoral or master's students with high potential for future leadership in international affairs. Fellowships include a scholarship, a research assistantship and all tuition fees.
- Chancellor Bennett Masters and Doctoral Scholarships are one of York's major awards for incoming doctoral or master's students entering a full-time program in the Liberal Arts. At the doctoral level, the award is renewable for a maximum of four years.

SPECIAL NOTE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

York welcomes applications from qualified international students. International Tuition Fee Scholarships are available to international students demonstrating academic excellence and financial need, on the recommendation of the graduate program. These scholarships are offered at the time of admission and are applied directly to fees to cover a significant portion of the difference between domestic and international fees.





THINK BEYOND YOUR PROGRAM

A master's degree in Kinesiology & Health Studies is the key to opening many doors for Ravindra Baldeo. A recent acceptance to law school has him thinking about his future in a whole new way. Although he is planning to finish his master's degree before choosing his next step, Ravindra is considering using his research experience to influence health care law and policy. "When I started my master's, I thought I wanted to pursue medicine. Being involved in research has shown me that there are a great range of careers available to me."



Think beyond your graduation

PLANNING FOR GRADUATE STUDIES

Preparing your application to graduate studies requires research and planning. Some students start preparing their plan for graduate studies as early as two years before they submit their application. Consider the following timelines to help guide you through a successful application process.

STARTING 2 YEARS BEFORE APPLYING

- Research topics that are of interest to you.
- Research graduate schools and programs, speak with your professors and a career counsellor.
- Consider who among your professors and contacts can provide you with a letter of recommendation and build those relationships.
- Prepare for any testing required for admission (e.g. GRE, MCAT, GMAT exams).
- Hone your field of interest and find out what school has professors with similar interests.
- Visit schools and Graduate Studies Information Fairs.
- Make note of application deadlines as they vary by program.
- Research funding opportunities (e.g. external scholarships).
- Take any testing required for admission and arrange to have your test results sent directly to York.
- Prepare a file with your best written and research work for your application.

6 MONTHS BEFORE

- Prepare your Statement of Interest.
- Contact your references for appropriate recommendation letters.
- Apply for funding opportunities.
- Ask a current professor to review your Statement of Interest and provide feedback.

4 WEEKS BEFORE

- Perfect your Statement of Interest.
- Have transcripts from your current or former institutions sent directly to York.
- Submit your application early or on time. Do not miss the deadline.

MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for admission to the Faculty of Graduate Studies, you must be a graduate of a recognized university and hold an Honours degree (four years of study) or equivalent. A minimum overall grade point average (GPA) of "B" or equivalent is required. Your GPA is assessed over the last two years (full-time equivalent) of study.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

Études françaises and Études francophones are taught in French. Translation Studies and Public & International Affairs are taught in English and French. All other programs are taught in English only.

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

If your first language is not English or French (for programs offered in French see above), you must show you have an acceptable level of English or French by completing a language proficiency test. If you have completed at least one year of full-time study at an accredited university in a country (or institution) where English or French is the official language of instruction, you may be exempt from this requirement. York University reserves the right to require a successfully completed language proficiency test.

 - Application fee: \$90 Cdn. (non-refundable)
2. Two official transcripts for every postsecondary institution you have attended.
 - Transcripts must come directly from, and bear the unbroken seal of, the issuing institution.
 - If transcripts are in a language other than English or French, an English translation is required.
 - If you have taken courses at York, we will obtain your York transcripts on your behalf. Be sure to include your York reference number on all correspondence.
 - If you have an outstanding debt with York University, the transcript will not be released and your application will not be processed.
3. Supplementary Information Form (if applicable) will be made available online after your application has been processed. yorku.ca/myfile

4. Letter of Recommendation Form will be made available online after your application has been processed. yorku.ca/myfile

5. Official language test scores, if applicable, sent directly from the test centre.

6. Any additional documentation required by the program to which you are applying, such as a sample of your written work or a statement of intent. For details, see the admission requirements information online at futurestudents.yorku.ca/graduate.

AFTER YOU APPLY

- You will receive an e-mail containing your York reference number to track the progress of your application through MyFile at yorku.ca/myfile
- Once all your documentation is submitted, your file is sent to the program for review.
- The program’s admission committee reviews your application and makes an admission decision.
- The program forwards decisions to the Office of Admissions (Graduate) who informs students of the admission decision via MyFile and with mailed confirmation.
- The Office of Admissions (Graduate) informs students of the admission decision via MyFile and with mailed confirmation. If you’re offered admission, you will receive a package outlining your next steps. You will also receive information from your program directly.
- Once you’ve been admitted, information about any financial support will come from the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
- The processing time of your application depends on when you apply, when your file is complete and when the program admission committee meets.
