Bachelor of Education

We offer two teacher education programs – Concurrent and Consecutive – leading to a Bachelor of Education (BEd) degree and a recommendation to the Ontario College of Teachers for an Ontario Certificate of Registration.

Our Concurrent BEd, to which you can apply from high school for select Faculties or after completing one year of university study, allows you to work toward your education degree while at the same time completing most other York undergraduate degrees. As a Concurrent BEd student, you work simultaneously to complete both your undergraduate degree and professional teaching program. Ontario high school applicants can be considered for the Concurrent BEd if they have been admitted to one of six faculties at York (Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Glendon, Health, Liberal Arts & Professional Studies, Science, and Lassonde School of Engineering) and submitted all required documents by the deadline date (April 11, 2014).

Concurrent BEd students can also specialize in French, Jewish, Indigenous, International and Technological teacher education. The Jewish Teacher option prepares you to teach Hebrew and Jewish studies in public and Jewish day schools. The French option, with most classes taught at Glendon, is for those who wish to teach in immersion, core, or extended French classrooms. For Indigenous Teacher Education, you need to complete Issues in Indigenous Education in your first year at university. You can also specialize in International Education by completing two internationally-focused elective courses, a program-based international experience, and a related co-curricular activity (32 hours of work). Technological Education is open to individuals enrolled in or who have completed a related applied field. All teacher candidates pursuing certification at the Intermediate/Senior level must have or will be completing a fouryear honours applied degree.

As a full-time Consecutive student, you study over one extended academic year once you complete your undergraduate degree.* This program is offered at several off-campus locations in and around

the Greater Toronto Area with teaching subjects taken at the Keele campus for Intermediate/Senior teacher candidates. Various locations are available. Applicants can also complete the Consecutive program on a part-time basis spanning three years. If you have already completed an undergraduate degree, you qualify to study in the full- or part-time consecutive program. Access Initiative - Valuing Your Experience

Our admissions policies are designed to assess the potential of all candidates, in particular those who have faced systemic barriers in educational settings and in their lives. Access invites students from the following underrepresented groups to apply as part of this initiative:

- Aboriginal (First Nations, Métis, Inuit, Status, Non-Status, Aboriginal Ancestry)
- Person with Disabilities
- Racialized Person (A racialized group is a group of people who may experience social inequities on the basis of their perceived common racial background, colour and/or ethnicity, faith and who may be subjected to differential treatment in society and its institutions. Examples may include: people of African descent, people of Asian descent, Latinos)
- Other Minoritized Person (please specify other identity categories that apply to you and have affected your educational experience. For example: people living in poverty; sexual orientation; English Language Learner; refugee or impacted by the refugee experience)

Choose from one of three levels:

Primary/Junior: (JK-6) No subject specialization required.

Junior/Intermediate: (4-10) Choose to specialize in one of the Junior/Intermediate Teaching Subjects (see Teaching Subjects). Intermediate/Senior: (7-12) Choose two Intermediate/Senior Teaching Subjects (see Teaching Subjects).

* Starting September 2015, the Consecutive Bachelor of Education program will be a four-semester (two year) program.



Jewish Teacher Education

Graduates can teach in public schools and Jewish day schools at all grade levels. Many students in this special course of study include a year's study in an Israeli university as a part of their program. For more information, visit our web site at edu.yorku.ca/jewish/

French Immersion

The BEd (French) degree is a unique bilingual option, which aims to prepare future French immersion teachers at all certification levels. Indigenous Teacher Education

The Indigenous Teacher Education option has been designed to prepare you to teach at all certification levels and to meet the needs of teaching indigenous material in appropriately respectful ways to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous students in a range of contexts. International Education

The Faculty of Education offers students in the Concurrent Bachelor of Education program the opportunity to specialize in International Education. This option responds to students' interests in teaching in international locations after they have graduated with a BEd and will help to prepare teacher candidates to teach in diverse classroom settings locally. Technological Education

The concurrent Bachelor of Education in Technological Education is only open to individuals enrolled in a related applied field. The part-time consecutive Bachelor of Education in Technological Education is available to individuals who have an approved degree in a related technology field that aligns with the Technological Education curriculum from an accredited degree granting institution.* Applicants must apply to the Intermediate/Senior certification level. Both the concurrent and part-time consecutive curriculum is delivered over three years. Concurrent BEd is taught in coordination with the programs offered at Ontario colleges/universities to ensure completion of requirements for both the Bachelor of Education and the related degree. The related degree must include at least 36 months of coursework and one year of cooperative education (i.e. related continuous employment terms of no less than four months each of wage-earning experience). An additional year of work experience will be required prior to graduation in order to be certified by the Ontario College of Teachers. Consecutive Parttime BEd applicants must have 2 years of work related experience. Graduates to our Bachelor of Education in Technological Education program will be certified to teach only for technological subjects. For more information, visit our web site at edu.yorku.ca/teched/



APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- If you have applied to York University's Faculty of Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Glendon, Health, Liberal Arts & Professional Studies, Science or Lassonde School of Engineering, with an admission average in the mid to high 80s, you may apply to the Direct Entry admission option for the Concurrent BEd. To indicate an interest in the Direct Entry option, you should include in your 101 application (OUAC code YET, YFK, YHR, YGJ, YLA, YPC, or YQ) the Faculty of Education and then select the major interest for Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Glendon, Health, Liberal Arts & Professional Studies, Science or Lassonde School of Engineering at York University. Applications are due January 15, 2014.
- Or you can apply during your first year at university with a minimum 24 credits (four full year courses) or the equivalent, and a minimum of 36 credits (six full-year courses) remaining to complete your academic degree. A minimum C+ overall average and be admitted to an undergraduate program in one of the Faculties of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies, Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Health, Science, Lassonde School of Engineering or Glendon is required, except for Technological Education.
- Selection is based on grade point average, related age-specific experience (as a classroom volunteer, coach, camp counsellor etc.), a personal statement and letters of reference.
- Applicants to the BEd (French) program must be proficient in French. Selection will also be based on successful completion of a French written test.
- Applicants to the Indigenous Teacher Education option must present a minimum C+ final grade in the course EDUC 2200 3.0 Issues in Indigenous Education prior to admission to the Faculty of Education.
- All applicants must submit an online supplementary application.
- If you are transferring to York from another university, complete the OUAC 105 form indicating your interest in the concurrent program, as well as the Faculty of Education Supplementary Information Form. The OUAC 105 form must be submitted to the Ontario Universities Application Centre in Guelph. All applicants must submit an online supplementary application.
- If you are applying to the concurrent Technological Education option, complete the OUAC 105 form indicating your interest in the concurrent BEd (Technological Education) and apply by January 31.





The Part-time Consecutive Program follows the Concurrent Curriculum. This program is for students who have already completed a degree.
