## RESEARCH & INNOVATION WORLDWIDE

York University recognizes the importance of understanding the United States and its relationship to Canada and the rest of the world. And when it comes to the United States, our academic connections run deep.

York's connections with the United States are vast and varied. For example, 766 York professors hold degrees from the United States and more than 25 York professors are conducting research throughout the USA on topics ranging from history and business to social sciences and equity studies.

## RESEARCH IN THE UNITED STATES

- Glendon history professor Yukari Takai is researching Japanese transmigration first to Canada, then across the Canada-United States border, between 1882 and 1941.
- Osgoode Hall Law School tax professor Neil Brooks co-authored a book that explored the social and political dangers of the growing income inequality in the US, as well as in Britain and Canada.
- York's Centre for Vision Research is working with MIT scientists to find ways to combat the disorientation experienced by astronauts in zerogravity environments.
- Physics and astronomy professor John Caldwell worked with the NASA Ames Research Center to develop a mission known as Kepler, with the goal of discovering Earthlike planets around other stars.

#### **CONNECTIONS AT YORK**

- York students pursuing their Juris Doctor diploma at Osgoode Hall Law School can participate in an exchange with NYU during their last two years of study.
- York maintains academic ties with Bridgewater State College, Ithaca, Yale, the State University of New York at Plattsburgh, Smiths College, Tufts University & Wellesley College.
- Political science professor Stephen Newman, an expert on US law and politics, was a member of York's delegation to the Montréal Roundtable on U.S. Studies, sponsored by the Foundation for Educational Exchange between Canada and the USA.

Students get hands-on research experience through York's iRAY program, which gives students paid positions assisting Canada's top researchers on campus.

### YORK OFFERS PAID INTERNSHIPS

York's internship programs provide students with hands-on work experience with some of Canada's top employers. Students earn a salary, explore potential career options and build a valuable network of industry contacts. Students in our Technology Internship Program, for example, earn an average of \$38,000 in a 12-month term.

#### CONNECTING STUDENTS WITH JOBS AND EMPLOYERS

Last year, York's Career Centre posted 8,500<sup>+</sup> employment opportunities with companies across Canada. Top employers also visit campus to connect with students at fairs, panels and other events. For students needing help with interviewing or resume-writing skills, there are more than 325 skills workshops offered throughout the year, in addition to private assistance options.

## INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE IS JUST THE START

Students can take part in York's International Internship Program, get work experience in a new country and receive \$3,000 from York to help get there. Alternatively, they can take one of our international degree programs, requiring a year of study abroad, to lay the groundwork for a global career.

### INTERNATIONAL DEGREES

Offering 100<sup>+</sup> exchange agreements with more than 100 universities worldwide, and more than 30 programs with an international component (such as an internship abroad), York students earn degrees that are recognized globally. By graduation, students are prepared for international success. The numbers say it all: six months after graduation, 92 per cent of York graduates are employed.
