Undeclared Major

Explore areas that interest you before you decide on a major. Taking courses from various disciplines will help you uncover your passions and strengths. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

African Studies

Learn more about the social, political, economic and cultural development of Africa from pre-colonial times to present day. Re-imagine Africa and its diasporas in terms of its centrality to world history. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Anthropology

Explore how people are subjected to, participate in, and contest living in a world interconnected by powerful economic, cultural and technological forces. Requirements for

Admission: Ontario Secondary School
Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U,
5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain
admission to this program, your academic
average should be in the mid-70s.

Business & Society

Gain an in-depth understanding of the impact of business on society and the relations between industry, social structures and government.
Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Business Economics

Learn strategic thinking necessary for understanding the role of business and government in the economy. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. Recommended: MCV4U. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Children, Childhood & Youth

This program takes a child-centred and children's rights-based approach to this field of study. Our interdisciplinary and humanities-based approaches include courses from sociology, psychology, literature, history, anthropology and human rights and equity studies. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Cognitive Science

Examine the nature of thought, memory, perception and language. Focus on areas like AI, linguistic development, comparative cognition and philosophical psychology. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Communication & Media Studies

Gain sound analytical skills to apply a critical lens to mass media and communication. Learn to question, analyze and creatively reflect on communication mediums. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Creative Writing

We believe good writing can be taught and that good writers can be trained to be better writers. Our faculty are all published writers with vast experience in a variety of genres. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses; personal statement of interest; 10–15-page portfolio of poems, stories, or personal essays. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s, with a minimum 75% required in ENG4U or EWC4U.

Criminology

Develop your understanding of the complexities of criminal justice issues and how these are shaped by larger social, political, economic, cultural and historical contexts. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low-80s.

Economics

We equip you with the skills to understand contemporary economic problems in various national and international markets. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. Recommended: MCV4U. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

English

We offer a full range of English literature courses from the medieval period to the present, with strengths in contemporary poetry, popular literature, and Canadian, American, African, South Asian and Caribbean literatures. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

English & Professional Writing

The only dual qualification program of its kind in Canada, this program blends English & Professional Writing into a single degree program that highlights and enhances the relationship between the two fields of study. Requirements

for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Financial & Business Economics

Study the financial sector and build your skills in monetary economics, banking, finance and financial data analysis. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. Recommended: MCV4U. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

French Studies

Explore French literature, language, linguistics and francophone culture in Canada and throughout the world. All of our courses are taught in French; small classes and a language assessment at time of enrolment ensure that French Studies majors are placed in the correct course according to their skills level. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Gender, Sexuality & Women's Studies

Gain the tools to critically explore how identity, power and culture intersect in work, life and society. Understand the impact of gender, race, class and more—across fields like art, science, law and politics. Join a community of changemakers driving social justice and shaping the future. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Global Political Studies

Learn diverse ways of thinking about 'the global' and globalization, as well as political community; diversity and inequality; and transformations in global, regional and domestic politics.

Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Health & Society

This program provides students with a toolkit for understanding health and illness, both as lived realities and as reflections of larger social, cultural and political processes. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

History

With courses that cover antiquity to present day, our undergraduate programs allow you to choose a specialization from a vast selection of areas. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M course. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Human Rights & Equity Studies

Examine human rights principles, the causes and impact of human rights violations and efforts to redress inequities. Understand physical, social and economic security, cultural autonomy, political rights and fundamental freedoms. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Humanities

Learn how people from various times and places have expressed cultural values, practices, and ideas of a philosophical, religious, moral, political and aesthetic nature. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Indigenous Studies

Indigenous Studies draws on Elder teachings, ceremonies and theories developed by Indigenous scholars to explore the multiple experiences of Indigenous communities in Canada and worldwide. The program also examines treaty rights and relationships. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Information Technology

Choose between our BA or BCom options and learn from research-driven faculty and industry professionals experienced in dynamic areas such as information retrieval, business analysis, cloud computing, I.T. strategy, data analytics, I.T. project management and information visualization. Requirements for Admission: BA: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 4U math, 4 additional 4U or M courses; BCom: OSSD or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission, your academic average should be in the mid-70s (BA) or low 80s (BCom).

Interdisciplinary Social Science

Explore diverse topics and methods and examine issues like inequality and the effects of power, climate change and settler colonialism through critical perspectives. Learn about issues related to social and political thought, social justice and diversity, sustainability and global development. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

International Development Studies

This program will challenge you to analyze colonialism and the developing world, the gap between rich and poor nations and the social, cultural, economic and political elements of international development case studies. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Law & Society

Drawing from fields like philosophy, anthropology and criminology, you'll focus on critical thinking, research and analysis. Gain a more profound knowledge of the law, how it has impacted the course of history and its role in society today. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Linguistics

Learn how language is naturally organized. Investigate sound and word patterns, sentence structure, syntax and language usage. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Philosophy

Covering views that include Western, East Asian, African and Islamic thought, our courses deliver a deep understanding of philosophy. You'll explore how the concepts of freedom, happiness and justice have evolved over time. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Philosophy of Law

Examine what it means to live in a society governed by law and investigate the moral and political values that underlie legal institutions. This program is ideal if you wish to pursue a career in law or any other law-related profession. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Political Science

Discover how to analyze social and political trends through rich, diverse courses, including global politics, political economy and power, international development and inequality, social justice, democracy and security. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Professional Writing

This program offers a unique opportunity to get practical experience in the profession of writing. Our students develop inventive approaches to writing that keep pace with cultural, social and technological changes. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Sociology

Learn more about the organization of cities, the impact of new technologies, and how consumption, racism, gender identities, migration and conflict shape social structures. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Speech & Language Sciences

One of only three in Canada, our program gives you an in-depth knowledge of linguistics and its relationship to language disorders. Learn how to diagnose and treat speech, language and communication disorders. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent: ENG4U, 4U math, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low 80s.


Work & Labour Studies

Focus on how work and labour are changing in our global society. Discover the complex nature of work and employment, the impact of globalization and the role of trade unions. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Commerce

Stand out to your future employer with one of nine streams: accounting*, business research, business technology management, entrepreneurship and innovation, finance**, human resource management, marketing, management or supply chain management. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low 80s.

*The accounting stream is a pathway to the Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA) designation.

**The finance stream is a pathway to two major designations: Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) and Certified Financial Planner (CFP).

Information Technology

We also offer a Bachelor of Commerce in Information Technology (see p.20).

Disaster & Emergency Management

Learn how to better understand and mitigate potential disasters. Students examine topics such as business continuity planning, emergency and disaster risk management, crisis communications, ethics and terrorism. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U or MDM4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.





Public Administration

Through public administration, Canadian government and public law courses, you'll examine current and emerging debates regarding public institutions, law, human rights and diversity. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 4U math, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-70s.

Human Resource Management

Study organizational behaviour, career management, industrial and labour relations, compensation, talent management, work law and labour policy. Benefit from our many in-class and community-focused learning opportunities. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 4U math, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.



Bachelor of Social Work

Social Work*

We are critical social work leaders committed to social justice, human rights and equity. We work with groups who have been marginalized and produce research that has a tangible impact on the community. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-80s.

Communication, Social Media & Public Relations Bachelor of Arts (BA)

This program is a new stream in the existing Bachelor of Arts program in Communication & Media Studies. It will equip students with a theoretical foundation in communications and media studies, while focusing on emerging scholarship in social media and public relations. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, 5 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 70s.

Entrepreneurship & Innovation Bachelor of Commerce (BCom)

This program is a new stream in the existing Bachelor of Commerce program offered by the School of Administrative Studies in LA&PS. Bridge traditional business theories and perspectives with emerging entrepreneurial pedagogy, while also exploring innovation strategies in diverse organizations. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low 80s.

<u>Financial Technologies</u> Bachelor of Science (BSc)

Financial technology is a rapidly expanding industry. This unique program responds to industry needs for students fluent in finance and new technologies. Students will combine computing and information technology training with economics and finance education to prepare for a career in technology-intensive roles. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U, SBI4U or SCH4U or SPH4U, 3 additional 4U or M courses. Recommended: MCV4U. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low 80s.

<u>Sport Management</u> Bachelor of Sport Management (BSM)

This program is for students looking to become global leaders in sport innovation and change. A Bachelor of Sport Management will help lay the foundations for competencies not only in management and business, but also in areas such as sociology, economics and media studies. Requirements for Admission: Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent, ENG4U, MHF4U or MDM4U, 4 additional 4U or M courses. To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low 80s.

Financial Support

At LA&PS we want to recognize your academic success and provide a financial boost to those who need it.

Here are just some of the scholarships and awards available to incoming students:

The Tom Janes Award for Black LA&PS Scholars: Valued at \$5,000 and awarded to full-time undergraduate students entering their first year of study in the Faculty.

The Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies Entrance Award: Valued at \$1,700 and available to students with an admission average of 85% or higher.
