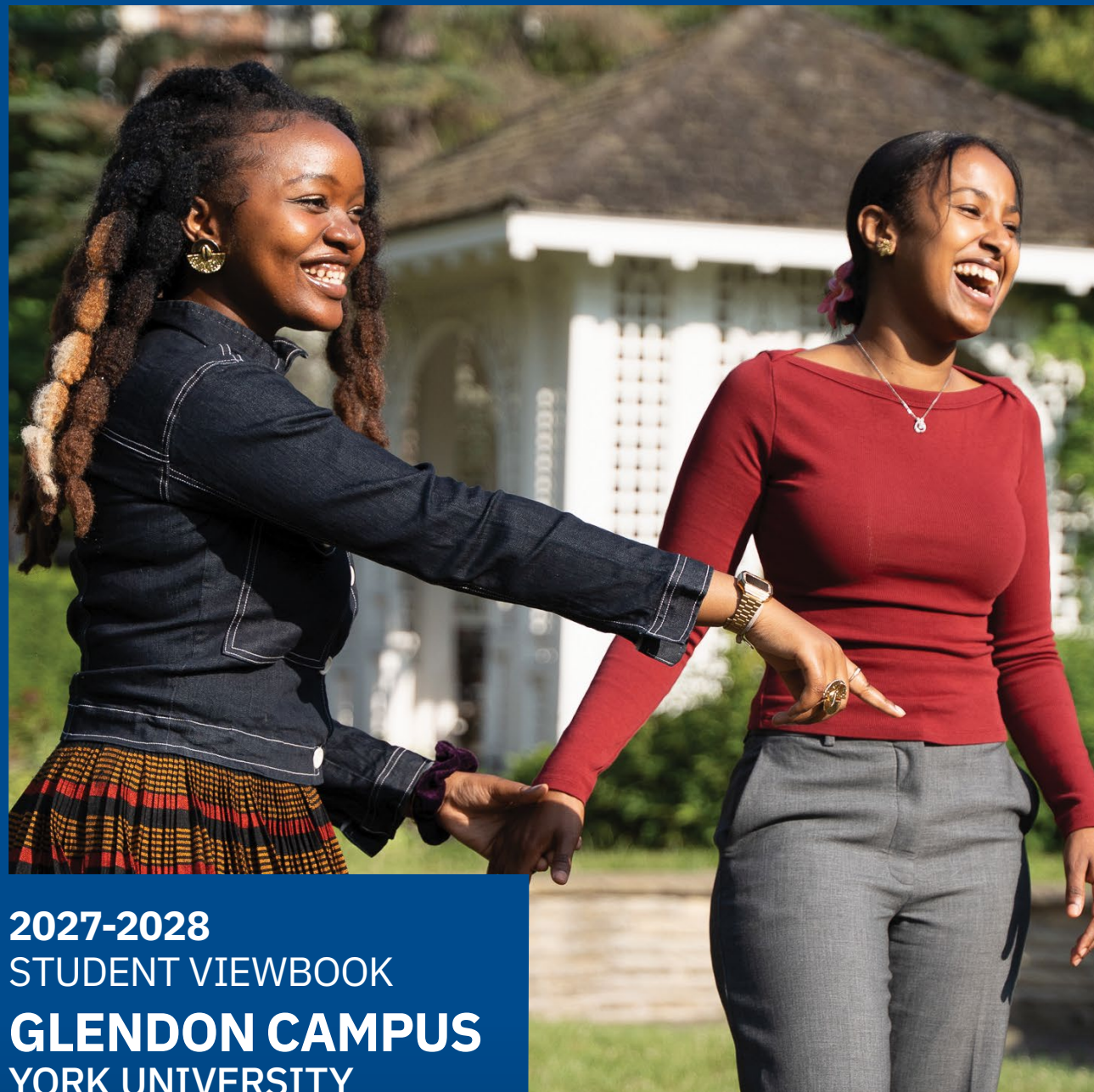

Land Acknowledgement

First Nations peoples have lived on this part of Turtle Island for millennia, stewarding the land, the water and all that contributes to life in this region. Today, the culture and presence of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples enrich the lands and people of this territory.

More than two centuries ago, the Mississauga people welcomed settlers to this territory, providing sustenance and engaging in trade and commerce. Between 1781 and 1820, eight treaties were signed between the Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, who opened their territory to settlement. Today, York University's Glendon Campus is located on Toronto Purchase Treaty, N° 13 lands and is situated on the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat and Haudenosaunee.

Treaty history is foundational, and it is our collective responsibility to honour the land, as we honour and respect those who have gone before us, those who are here and those who have yet to come. We are grateful for the opportunity to be learning, working and thriving on this land, and we commit to learn the truth and be active in the process of reconciliation.

Programs & Certificates

Biology

BSc, iBSc, Major, Minor

Interested in conservation biology, biotechnology, ecology, and more? Our small classes offer a personalized experience with advanced hands-on research opportunities rarely offered before you reach grad school. As the first and only bilingual Biology BSc in Southern Ontario to offer courses in English and French, our program is uniquely qualified to address a provincial need for bilingual health-related professionals.

Business Economics

BA, iBA, Major

Have a business and management mindset but also want to perfect your people skills? Our Business Economics program combines business administration and economics with a special emphasis on international business and humanities. Your degree will provide you with the fundamental principles of economic theory, and managerial and accounting skills for the business world. Interested in internships? French Studies

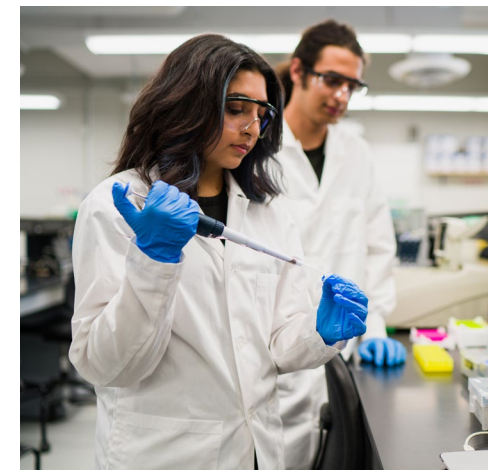

While we believe that studying another language opens minds and doors, some students come to us with no prior knowledge of French, while others are multilingual. Knowledge of a second language is not a pre-requisite and we're here to support your progression regardless of where you start and how far you wish to go.

Which path is right for me?

I don't speak French, or I don't wish to obtain a bilingual degree.

You'll complete just **two French courses (6 credits)** at your level of placement, giving you more room to focus on your major. A wide range of programs offer this option.

Graduate with a Glendon Degree with the minimal language requirement

I want to graduate with a bilingual degree.

You'll complete **6 credits in French at the 2000 level, either in a French as a second language course, or a course that is taught in French.** A quick assessment will help determine your starting point – either at the introductory level where you can build up your skills gradually, or at a more advanced level if you're already fluent.

Graduate with a Glendon degree bearing a bilingual designation

I identify as First Nations, Métis, or Inuit and want to take Indigenous language courses.

You'll complete a minimum of **6 credits in an Indigenous language—including Anishinaabemowin (Ojibway) or Kanien'kéha (Mohawk)**—instead of French or English. This option is available in select Glendon BA programs. Check with our Academic Advising team for details.

ACUFC French as a Second Language (FSL) Bursary – \$3,000

English-speaking Canadian students can receive a \$3,000 bursary to support their postsecondary studies in French. This program, established by the Government of Canada, encourages students whose first official language is English to pursue postsecondary studies in French. Eligible applicants must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents, have completed high school in English, and be enrolled full-time in an undergraduate program.

*You don't have to wait for an offer of admission to complete an application for a scholarship. Submit early to be considered for as many awards as possible (from both Glendon and York) – some deadlines are as early as mid-February, while the MyFile application closes on **April 1**.*

- A Proof of language proficiency (if required)

Submit Your Application

Submit your application through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) at ouac.on.ca as early as **September 2026**.

Applicants from outside of Ontario or with previous post-secondary education may apply directly via the York University application for most programs.

Outstanding required documents can be uploaded onto our system, MyFile, once your application has been submitted.

Required documents may include: official transcripts (unofficial grades may be uploaded for conditional admission), proof of language proficiency and supplementary information (if required for your program). Your MyFile account will provide details if additional documentation is needed.

Stay on Top of Your Application

After you apply to Glendon, you'll receive an acknowledgement of your application via e-mail and a reminder to send all outstanding documents on time. You can check your application status, make sure documents have been received and upload documents electronically through MyFile.
