When you apply to York University as an international student for Fall 2027, you'll automatically be considered for an entrance scholarship on the basis of your final admission average.

President's International Scholarship of Excellence

\$180,000

(\$45,000* x 4 years)

Recognizes international high school students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership skills, volunteer service and/or extracurricular activities.

A scholarship application is required.
Apply by January 27, 2027.

* Renewable for an additional three years of full-time, undergraduate study, as long as you maintain high academic standing each year.

Fees & Expenses

As a first-year international student, it's important to map out expenses and plan your budget wisely.

After accepting your offer, international students are required to pay a non-refundable registration deposit of \$2,000 in order to receive their Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) and enrol in courses. This deposit is part of your tuition fee and will be credited to your student account.

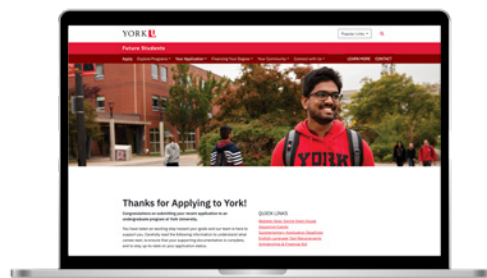
